A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO

Dear Friends,

Cincinnati Public Radio (CPR) continued to build on its brand name this fiscal year with newsworthy updates on our new building plans. The ongoing pandemic provided time for additional studies of our previously announced location at 9th and Elm Streets in downtown Cincinnati. Those studies proved invaluable, and it was determined building at the site would double the demolition and remediation costs. The search for a new location, our decision to build in the Evanston community and our return to Cincinnati City Council to seek approval for the new site made headlines.

It was exciting to be a part of the sold-out *The Moth Mainstage* live storytelling event through our partnership with Memorial Hall. The development team hosted a pre-reception where our staff members could mix and mingle with 91.7 WVXU and 88.5 WMUB donors. One of the highlights of the evening was the round of applause our Morning Edition host, Maryanne Zeleznik, received as she gave the introductory greetings to the sold-out crowd at Memorial Hall, proving once again the value of being an NPR station.

The Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra Girls Rock! - Lollipops concert allowed us to greet 90.9 WGUC listeners and introduce new families to our classical radio station and Classics for Kids radio program. Mid-day radio host Elaine Diehl was a featured presenter, and our kazoos were popular takeaways for those who stopped by our table in Music Hall.



We want to thank Otto Budig, Jr., for his commitment to this organization. Mr. Budig transitioned from board chair at the close of this fiscal year. We are grateful he will continue to contribute to Cincinnati Public Radio with his wealth of business acumen, especially as we move forward in the next steps of our new building campaign.

As we move forward with our plans to build new studios and office space, expand our digital brand and grow our audiences, we are even more excited about the future of public radio in Cincinnati. Thank you to our staff, supporters and volunteers who help us bring the great content we create to the masses. Read on to learn about CPR's work to inform, entertain, and engage with the Greater Cincinnati community through our music, News/Talk stations, community events, and educational outreach programs.




Congratulations to Lloyd Bryant for 40 Years at WGUC



Cincinnati Opera's season premier concert, Opera in the Park, was a fast sell-out, but thanks to our partnership, 90.9 WGUC broadcast the concert live from the beautiful Summit Park in Blue Ash. Wilks Artistic Director of the Cincinnati Opera) and Suzanne Bona (host and producer of Sunday Baroque) guided visitors and radio listeners through a preview of the Opera's upcoming season, including performances from *Tosca*, Carmen and The Barber of Seville. Summit Park was home to the 2021 Cincinnati Opera season, with a scaled-down production presented in a socially distanced setting. Audio Recording and Mastering Engineer Stephen Baum, VP of Engineering Don Danko and Classics for Kids intern Derrick Smith worked behind the scenes to bring the music to our radio listeners.

Corbett Studio was full of live music for our first-ever Make Music Monday event in May. WGUC announcers Brian O'Donnell, Elaine Diehl and Andy Ellis conducted interviews with local musicians as part of the live performances. Welcome, Lucy May, Cincinnati Edition Host

Award-winning journalist and self-proclaimed NPR Nerd Lucy May took over as host of *Cincinnati Edition* after Michael Monks announced his resignation. Lucy brings 25 years of reporting experience to our flagship news magazine show, airing weekdays at noon and 8 p.m. Lucy's experience covering some of the most challenging community issues in Cincinnati has not gone unnoticed by listeners who have commented on her ability to ask questions that get to the heart of the matter and walk them through complex stories with understanding and ease.



CCM Radio Theatre

WVXU and U.C.'s College-Conservatory of Music joined forces for a new radio play competition - CCM Radio Theatre. The contest was opened to current and former U.C. students who submitted an original short play for a chance to win cash prizes. U.C. alumnus Cedric Rose was named the CCM Radio Theatre playwright competition winner with his play Ketchup. The winning plays were produced by CCM Playwrights and performed by CCM students inside a WVXU studio and broadcast on 91.7 WVXU. Debates

WVXU brought you two candidate debates in partnership with The Ohio Debate Commission. Lucy May, the host of WVXU's Cincinnati Edition, served as moderator for the Ohio Gubernatorial Democratic primary debate between former Cincinnati mayor John Cranley and former Dayton mayor Nan Whaley. WVXU aired the hour-long debate live on-air and online. WVXU also broadcast the Commission's debates for Ohio's open U.S. Senate seat.

WVXU Local Government Reporter Becca Costello served on the panel for the Cincinnati Enquirer-sponsored debate between David Mann and Aftab Pureval. 91.7 WVXU also brought this debate to listeners live on-air and online.



Voter Guide

There was strong interest in the WVXU Voter Guide. The voter guide's website page had nearly 6,500 unique visitors leading up to the November election. The voter guide provided information for the 2021 Cincinnati City Council. Cincinnati Public Schools Board and Hamilton County ballot issues. The report, A voter guide to where 2021 Cincinnati Council candidates stand on the issues, by Local Government Reporter Becca Costello was a popular read with nearly 16,000 views of the article.





The Ohio Newsroom

One of the most significant collaborative efforts from Ohio public radio stations launched this year with the establishment of The Ohio Newsroom (TON), the largest statewide radio and digital news service in the Buckeye State. In many cities and towns across the country, newspapers and television stations are dwindling, limiting the number of viable options for those seeking unbiased local news. information, and community. TON will help tell the stories from Ohio's news deserts and produce reports of statewide significance. Cincinnati Public Radio, Ideastream (Cleveland), WOSU Public Media (Columbus); and WYSO (Yellow Springs) are founding members. WGTE (Toledo); WCSU (Wilberforce); and WYSU (Youngstown) have joined as participating stations. Cincinnati Public Radio Digital Platform Manager Jim Nolan designed the TON logo.

For more than 10 years, both Cincinnati Public Radio stations have been broadcasting using HD Radio technology. HD improves the broadcast sound and allows us to offer unique subchannels of music not readily available over the airways. On WVXU HD2, we air Radio Artifact, a local alternative station. On WGUC HD2, it's a 24-hour jazz service; on WGUC HD3, it's Inhailer Radio, another local alternative station. These stations are available on HD Radios and streaming on our websites. Without listener support we would not have been able to install new state-of-the-art transmitters for WGUC, WVXU and WMUB to provide strong and reliable signals.
